SUMMARY BACKGROUND: The Town of Prescott Valley (Town) is a founding member and fiscal agent of the Upper Verde River Watershed Protection Coalition (Coalition). Created in June, 2006, the Coalition's objective includes protecting the base flow of the Upper Verde River to the maximum extent possible and reaching Safe Yield in the Prescott Active Management Area. The Coalition wishes to leverage its budget, derived through membership dues, by applying for grants to fund Coalition projects. The Coalition would like to apply for a grant from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation for up to \$25,000 to supplement the construction costs for a pilot-scale rainwater harvesting and recharge project on property owned by the Town of Chino Valley (Old Home Manor property).

The grant program allows for potential funding in additional years without applying for a new grant. Any matching funds or other grant requirements are the responsibility of the Coalition and constrained by its budget. As fiscal agent for the Coalition, the Town will be responsible for administering the grants. The Town Council must give approval before the Coalition can pursue this grant.

PREVIOUS ACTIONS: On May 10, 2012, Council approved a Right of Way agreement with the Town of Chino Valley for a Macro Rainwater Harvesting Project. On June 14th, 2012, March 22, 2012, April 14, 2011 August 8, 2010, June 10, 2010, April 22, 2010, March 11, 2010 and November 19, 2009, the Town Council approved the Coalition moving forward on a number of grant applications. On June 8, 2006, the Town Council entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Yavapai County, the City of Prescott, the Town of Chino Valley and the Town of Dewey-Humboldt to create the Upper Verde River Watershed Protection Coalition.

On February 22, 2007, the Town Council approved membership contributions for the Coalition for \$55,000 per year.

OPTION ANALYSIS: The Council may vote to:

- 1.) approve this proposal, **OR**
- 2.) not approve this proposal, **AND/OR**
- 3.) direct staff to pursue other options.

ACTION OPTION: Consent approval for the Coalition's proposal to pursue the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation grant. **VOTE.**

RECOMMENDATION: Town staff recommend approval of this proposal to pursue the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation Grant

FISCAL ANALYSIS: If the Coalition obtains grant funding, the Town will administer the funds according to requirements of the grant.
