

## RESOLUTION NO. 1828

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PRESCOTT VALLEY, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF ARIZONA, SETTING FORTH THE OFFICIAL RETURNS OF THE PRIMARY ELECTION OF THE TOWN OF PRESCOTT VALLEY, DULY CALLED AND HELD ON THE 12<sup>TH</sup> DAY OF MARCH, 2013, AS AN "ALL-MAIL BALLOT" ELECTION; DECLARING THE CANDIDATES ELECTED; APPROVING PROPOSITION 422 REFERRING TO THE PEOPLE THE QUESTION OF CONTINUING FOR FOUR YEARS THE TOWN'S CURRENT ALTERNATIVE EXPENDITURE LIMITATION HOME RULE OPTION); APPROVING PROPOSITION 423 ADOPTING THE REVISED GENERAL PLAN 2025 AND CALLING FOR A MAY 21, 2013 GENERAL (RUNOFF) ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING ONE 2-YEAR TERM COUNCIL MEMBER; PROVIDING THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE EFFECTIVE FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND APPROVAL ACCORDING TO LAW.

WHEREAS, the Town of Prescott Valley, Arizona, duly called and held its Primary Election pursuant to ARS §9-821.01(a) and Town Code §2-03-010; and

WHEREAS, said Primary Election was conducted on March 12, 2013 as an All-Mail Ballot Election in accordance with ARS §16-409; and

WHEREAS, said Primary Election was held for the purpose of: A) electing a Mayor and two (2) Council members to four-year terms and one (1) Council member to a two-year term, B) approving/rejecting Proposition 422 referred to the people by the Prescott Valley Town Council which continues for four years the Town's current Alternative Expenditure Limitation (Home Rule) and approving/rejecting Proposition No. 423 adopting the revised *General Plan 2025*; and

WHEREAS, the qualified electors did cast a total of 7,087 ballots; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with ARS §§16-311(i)(1) and §16-408(d), the Town contracted with the Board of Supervisors and County Recorder of Yavapai County to provide election services for the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Official Final Results of the Primary Election have been reported to the Town Clerk from the Elections Department of the Yavapai County Recorder's Office; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with §9-821 and Article 11, Chapter 4, Title 16 of the ARS, it is required that the Mayor and Council canvas said election returns and enter the same as an official record of the Town;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Common Council of the Town of Prescott Valley, as follows:

Section 1. That it be hereby declared that the following named persons received the following number of votes:

Section 2. That it be hereby declared that the following named person was duly and regularly elected by the qualified electors of the Town of Prescott Valley, Arizona, as Mayor, having received votes on a majority of ballots cast in the Primary Election on March 12, 2013.

Section 3. That it be hereby declared that the following two named persons were duly and regularly elected by the qualified electors of the Town of Prescott Valley, Arizona, as 4-Year Term Council members, having received votes on a majority of ballots cast in the Primary Election on March 12, 2013.

Section 4. That it be hereby declared that none of named persons received a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors of the Town of Prescott Valley, Arizona, for the 2-Year Term Council member position, according to the ballots cast in the Primary Election on March 12, 2013. Therefore, a runoff General Election will be scheduled for May 21, 2013 to elect one 2-Year Term Council member nominated in the Primary Election between the two highest vote getters:

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Matt Zurcher 1,830

Section 5. That it be hereby declared that the OFFICIAL RESULTS from the Primary Election held on March 12, 2013 on Proposition 422 (“a resolution referred to the people by the Prescott Valley Town Council which continues for four years the town’s current alternative expenditure limitation”), show voters casting the following number of votes:

Section 6. That it be hereby declared that Proposition 422 (“a resolution referred to the people by the Prescott Valley Town Council which continues for four years the town’s current alternative expenditure limitation”), has been duly approved and adopted by the qualified electors.

Section 7. That it be hereby declared that the OFFICIAL RESULTS from the Primary Election held on March 12, 2013 on Proposition 423 (“a resolution referred to the people of Prescott Valley Town Council which adopts an amended *General Plan 2025* for the Town”), show voters casting the following number of votes:

<b>YES</b>	<b>3,476</b>	<b>(55.75%)</b>
<b>NO</b>	<b>2,759</b>	<b>(44.25%)</b>

Section 8. That it be hereby declared that Proposition 423 (“a resolution referred to the people by the Prescott Valley Town Council which adopts an amended *General Plan 2025* for the Town”), has been duly approved and adopted by the qualified electors.

Section 9. The OFFICIAL RESULTS from the Primary Election held on March 12, 2013, show the following number of rejected ballots:

Section 10. That this Resolution shall be effective from and after its passage and approval according to law.
