SUMMARY/BACKGROUND: Each year, the Prescott Valley Police Department (PVPD) continues to participate in the statewide highway safety campaign led by the Governor’s Office of Highway Safety (GOHS). Past grant funds have been utilized to enhance our efforts in highway safety, underage drinking prevention, DUI and select traffic enforcement, and public awareness and education. These funds have enabled us to routinely staff officers on holidays and weekends for DUI saturation patrols, speed details, underage party patrols, CUB details and other select traffic enforcement activities. These activities are often planned in conjunction with state and neighboring agencies for maximum effectiveness in our quad-city area.

On March 24, 2014 the department received notice from GOHS that 2014 Highway Safety Plan funds have been awarded in the amount of \$3,000 to participate in the “Buckle Up Arizona... It’s the Law!” campaign. This program is part of the national “Click It or Ticket” campaign. Prescott Valley PD was selected to receive funding for this year’s program based on our agency’s participation last year and our continued stellar effort on enforcing traffic laws. PVPD will utilize these grant funds for proactive off-duty enforcement activities during May 19 through June 1, 2014. Officers will be deployed during peak traffic times for maximum effectiveness in enforcing Arizona’s secondary seat belt law for occupant protection which includes safety belts and child passengers.

As part of the award acceptance, PVPD is required to provide a certified resolution authorizing entry into the contract with GOHS.

OPTIONS ANALYSIS: The Town Council may either accept the grant award from the Governor’s Office of Highway Safety through Resolution No. 1876 and approve the Buckle Up Arizona Enforcement Grant Contract # 2014-CIOT-014, or decline the grant award.

ACTION OPTION: Motion to authorize the Mayor (or, in his absence, the Vice Mayor) to sign Resolution No. 1876 approving the 2014 Governor’s Office of Highway Safety Buckle Up Arizona Enforcement Grant Contract # 2014-CIOT-014 and accept the grant award, OR Motion not to approve Resolution No. 1876. **VOTE.**

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approving the Buckle Up Arizona Enforcement Grant Contract # 2014-CIOT-014 accepting the grant award.

FISCAL ANALYSIS: There is no fiscal impact to the Town. This grant is fully reimbursable through the Governor's Office of Highway Safety in the amount of \$3,000.
