SUMMARY/BACKGROUND: The Partners against Narcotics Trafficking (PANT) Task Force is a multi-agency unit dedicated to the enforcement of narcotics laws and the suppression of criminal gang activities, with particular attention to street, prison and biker gangs. Through interagency cooperation, the PANT Task Force is able to focus on identifying targets and initiating investigations on individuals and/or gangs involved in the cultivation, manufacturing, sale or distribution of narcotics or dangerous drugs in Yavapai County. The task force also provides support services and resources to other Yavapai County agencies that become involved in narcotic investigations. Additionally, PANT solicits community involvement and education through public speaking engagements with various civic organizations and the Yavapai County school districts. It is through this partnership among agencies and communities that the PANT Task Force has attained continued successful interdiction, apprehension and prosecution of subjects involved in the illicit drug trade in Yavapai County.

Each participating agency provides staff and resources for operation of the PANT Task Force. In addition, each year the task force submits application to the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission (ACJC) to receive funding assistance for personnel and other operating expenses. Administration of grant funding received is determined by the PANT Task Force Committee. In early 2010, it was decided that Prescott Valley would administer the terms of the current and future ACJC grant awards.

On June 4, 2015 the department received notice from ACJC of a FY 2016 Award in the amount of \$408,756.00 under the Drug, Gang and Violent Crime Control Grant Program. Funds will be utilized for personnel expenses (salaries and fringe benefits/overtime) for the following task force positions:

- 1 Commander
- 2 Sergeants
- 1 PT Office Coordinator

OPTIONS ANALYSIS: The Town Council may either accept the grant award from the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission and approve the Drug, Gang and Violent Crime Control FY 2016 Award #DC-16-011, or decline the grant award.

ACTION OPTION: Motion to approve the Drug, Gang and Violent Crime Control FY 2016 Grant Award #DC-16-011, **OR** Motion not to accept this grant award. **VOTE.**

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approving the Drug, Gang and Violent Crime Control FY 2016 Grant Award #DC-16-011.

FISCAL ANALYSIS: There is no fiscal impact to the Town. This grant is fully reimbursable through the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission in the amount of \$408,756.00.
