Per discussions between members of the business community and town staff, Prescott Valley Economic Development Foundation (PVEDF) supports the following modifications to the weed abatement process: For egregious or hazardous situations we support an accelerated time line for abatement to 30 days. The current time line and process for "normal" weed situations should remain unchanged. Notification to the property owner should be clear as to whether the situation has been classified as hazardous, or not, and what the applicable time line is for abatement.
