

RESOLUTION No. 1749

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PRESCOTT VALLEY, ARIZONA SUPPORTING THE TOWN'S PARTICPATION IN THE PURSUIT OF REGIONAL COOPERATION FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, the quality of life that all citizens enjoy is positively impacted by the health of the economy in Central Yavapai County; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to strengthen and diversify the region's economy for the betterment of all citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Prescott Valley agrees with the need to promote the Region as a desirable location for business and light industry; and

WHEREAS, the City of Prescott, Town of Prescott Valley, Town of Chino Valley, Town of Dewey-Humboldt, and Yavapai County understand the need to create quality, permanent jobs within the Region; and

WHEREAS, the City of Prescott, Town of Prescott Valley, Town of Chino Valley, Town of Dewey-Humboldt, and Yavapai County recognize the need to maximize the limited public and private resources available for promotion and economic development in the Region; and

WHEREAS, the City of Prescott, Town of Prescott Valley, Town of Chino Valley, Town of Dewey-Humboldt, and Yavapai County wish to pursue the coordination of their economic development efforts with a strong regional program supported by both the public and private sectors that promotes the entire Region.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Prescott Valley do hereby state that the Town of Prescott Valley supports the pursuit of regional economic development and desires the continued efforts to create a regional entity for marketing, advertising, and otherwise promoting economic development within Central Yavapai County for the purpose of recruiting new businesses and industries, and endorses the effort of the Central Arizona Partnership and its plan to coordinate the public and private economic development efforts in Central Yavapai County and further directs Town staff to continue to pursue this effort in conjunction with the Central Arizona Partnership.
