SUMMARY/BACKGROUND: The Governor's Office of Highway Safety (GOHS) recently solicited grant proposals to enhance highway safety programs throughout Arizona for the 2012 Federal Fiscal Year. Through Council's approval, the Prescott Valley Police Department (PVPD) submitted an application to receive funding for a comprehensive program which focuses on preventing and taking enforcement action on DUI and errant driving behaviors utilizing various methods throughout Prescott Valley.

On August 30, 2011, PVPD received notification from GOHS of a grant award providing funds in the amount of \$33,000 for selective traffic enforcement equipment. The funds will be utilized for the purpose of conducting educational and enforcement activities throughout the award period of October 1, 2011 to September 30, 2012. Funds will support the purchase of one (1) marked police package motorcycle and six (6) radar units to enhance education and enforcement of errant driving.

Acceptance of the Highway Safety Contract requires a certified Council Resolution authorizing entry into the contract with GOHS.

OPTIONS ANALYSIS: Council may either accept the GOHS Contract 2012-PT-038 through Resolution No. 1766, and approve the purchase of one (1) motorcycle and six (6) radar units in their respective amounts, **or** decline to adopt the resolution.

ACTION OPTION: Motion to authorize the Mayor (or, in his absence, the Vice Mayor) to sign Resolution No. 1766 accepting the GOHS Contract 2012-PT-038, and to approve the purchase of one (1) motorcycle and six (6) radar units in their respective amounts **OR** Motion not to approve. **VOTE.**

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends authorizing signature of Resolution No. 1766 accepting the grant award and approving the authorized purchases in their respective amounts.

FISCAL ANALYSIS: There is no fiscal impact to the Town. This grant is fully reimbursable through the Governor's Office of Highway Safety.
