

SUMMARY BACKGROUND: The Transportation Enhancement (TE) program has been developed by the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to assist communities in development of projects that enhance surface transportation activities. The TE program is made possible by the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 (ISTEA), re-authorized in 1998 under the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), and SAFETEA-LU re-authorization by the current U.S. congressional session.

Prescott Valley has been a successful participant in the TE program in previous years for the following projects:

The Public Works Department is submitting two TE applications for consideration in 2012 (Round 19). One is for the next phase of the PV Pipeline Multi-Use Path Phase 4A (state administered), and the other for PV Pipeline Multi-Use Path Phase 4B (locally administered). A Resolution for Phase 4B application from the Town is necessary for this application. The resolution states that the Town will contribute at least 5.7% towards construction costs and a \$5,000 ADOT administration fee for the PV Pipeline Multi-Use Path Phase 4B; all costs associated with the PV Pipeline Ph 4A Multi-Use-Path will be the responsibility of ADOT.

OPTION ANALYSIS: The Council may vote to:

- 1.) Approve the resolution, **OR**
- 2.) Not approve the resolution, **AND/OR**
- 3.) Direct staff to pursue other options

ACTION OPTION: Motion to authorize the Mayor (or, in his absence, the Vice Mayor) to sign Resolution No. 1791 in support of the 2012 Transportation Efficiency Grant Application for the PV Pipeline Multi-Use Path, Phase 4B, **OR** Motion not to approve the resolution. **VOTE.**

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of the Resolution. This application for funding will be constructed at a fraction of the cost due to major subsidies provided by the Federal Highways Administration (administered by ADOT).

FISCAL ANALYSIS: If the Town is successful in obtaining grant approval for one or both projects, Town staff will request the Council's consideration of official creation of these projects and budgeting the Town's portion of the funding for the projects.

RESOLUTION NO. 1791

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PRESCOTT VALLEY, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF ARIZONA, APPROVING THE TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT (ARIZONA TEA-21) GRANT APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL FUNDS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE PV PIPELINE PHASE 4B MULTI-USE PATH, AUTHORIZING ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT AND COMPLETE THE ACTIVITIES OUTLINED IN SAID APPLICATION; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE EFFECTIVE AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND APPROVAL ACCORDING TO LAW.

WHEREAS, in response to the high level of interest shown by the citizens of the Town of Prescott Valley for the development of alternative transportation (pedestrian and bicycle) facilities within the Town, the Mayor and Common Council desire to submit a Transportation Enhancement (Arizona TEA-21) Grant Application for federal funds for the development of such alternative transportation facilities; and

WHEREAS, on 16 October 2001, the Parks & Recreation Commission adopted a Town of Prescott Valley Pedestrian/Bicycle Master Plan designating the proposed locations for the various types of alternative transportation facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Prescott Valley General Plan 2020, adopted on 17 January 2002 and ratified in a public vote on 12 March 2002, includes full utilization and implementation of the Prescott Valley Pedestrian/Bicycle Master Plan throughout the General Plan 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) is responsible for the administration of the program within the state, establishing rules and procedures governing the application process; and

WHEREAS, ADOT requires that all grant applications submitted to fund these types of alternative transportation projects must have a Resolution from the Mayor and Common Council committing to the proposed project; and

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PRESCOTT VALLEY, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Mayor and Common Council approve the filing of the Transportation Enhancement (Arizona TE-21) Grant Application for federal funding to develop the project known as the PV Pipeline Phase 4B Multi-Use Path, and
2. That the Mayor and Common Council hereby commit to the funding match and any overmatch, schedule, and other commitments for this project as outlined in the grant application. The budgeting of this funding will occur in the fiscal year for which the project expenditures are expected to occur; and
3. That this resolution shall be effective after its passage and approval according to law.
